Annual reports file drawers in reference area

What are annual reports? Publicly traded companies (you can buy stock in them) that meet certain criteria are required to file financial reports annually with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). Of the many report types, the investor population is most familiar with the 10-K, a document that is filed annually and is sometimes referred to as a company's annual report. Because the 10-K includes a tremendous amount of detail and legal jargon, most companies also produce a more reader-friendly annual report that typically contains product information, photographs, charts, a letter from the CEO, and other company and financial data, which are distributed to the shareholders. Most investors consider the annual report to be the most useful and credible tool for gaining a comprehensive overview of a company.

Ward's Business Directory REF HG 4057.A47

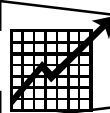
Eight-volume alphabetical listing of company profiles. Listed both by SIC and newer NAIC codes. (SIC is 4 digits, NAIC is 5 or 6 digits.)

Investor information packets are available free from corporations from the company's investor relations department. Financial info in this packet includes the most recent annual, 10-K, and 10-Q reports; press releases; and analysts' reports.

Definition: A company's **10-K**, or **Form 10-K**, is its Annual Report as filed with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). The 10-K filed with the SEC typically differs from its basic Annual Report in that it contains more detailed financial information as mandated by the SEC, with a more comprehensive description of its business and business risks and uncertainties. The Form 10-K is required by the SEC to be filed 90 days after the fiscal year end.
